# **Reach Out and Read**

Keeping in mind the importance of reading among students, GCMSA will focus, this year, on the Reach Out and Read program. We would like to partner with one or two area schools to mentor students in promoting reading skills.

Following is a message received from one of the schools.

Dr. DANA D. DYSON.
SUBJECT: WOODCROFT-EISENHOWER
COMMUNITY MENTOR PARTNERSHIP

The overall goals of the program are to increase reading proficiency to 55% by June 30, 2019 and to meet the learning target: R.F.2.4. Common Core, which reads that "student can read with accuracy and fluency." Thus, the objective of the WECMP is to help Eisenhower School meet its goals by supporting the teachers in their efforts to increase the reading speed and fluency of each student. In the 2018-2019 academic school year, given the new standards set by the State of Michigan to retain students in the 3rd grade who read below grade-level, we will continue to work with the students who were in the pilot program during the 2017 – 2018 school

year, as they progress into the 3rd grade. The program will run twice in 2018-2019. From September to November 2018, we will mentor 3rd graders. Then, we will mentor a new group of 2nd graders from February to May 2019. Each program will run for approximately 8 weeks. Unfortunately, the school does not have the space to run the program for both grades, concurrently.

Dr. Dyson notes that children need books to practice their skills and the program is looking for volunteers to mentor the children (training is available for participant volunteers). Dr. Dyson will attend the International Luncheon as our guest. She will personally share the needs of the WECMP program, how we can participate/help, and successes that have been documented thus far. She is excited to meet Alliance members and is grateful for any help and support we can give to the program which helps Flint students to meet their needs.
